OKLAHOMA CITY BECOMES THE CAPITAL. Special to The Messenger. Guthrie, Nov. 30.—Following the action of the state legislature yesterday in passing a law removing the state capital to Oklahoma City, sergeants-at-arms of the house and senate arrived today to take possession of the legislative furniture and equipment. No opposition was offered here to the removal.

NEGRO BOY OFF ON A JOY RIDE

Took Dr. Haart's Machine and Was Located on Bolivar—He Was Locked Up.

Some excitement was caused Wednesday about noon when it became known that Dr. Haart's automobile had been stolen from its usual standing place on North Bolivar street, near the Lake drug store. In a few minutes many people were out looking for the lost machine.

About noon T. L. Logan noticed a negro boy in the machine and asked him where he got it and if it was not Dr. Haart's. The negro told him that it belonged to Dr. Taylor and that he brought it from Fort Worth the night before. Soon after this Dr. Haart came down from his office and went out to get his auto to go to dinner but found it was gone and he was told that a negro boy had driven it off. Then the search was on in earnest. The negro was seen to drive it down North Bolivar street toward the Texas & Pacific passenger station and past the station. Soon Dr. Haart and Wood Lake located the boy in the machine on North Columbus street in front of Mrs. Pierce's residence. The boy had backed the machine and had the rear wheels in the ditch. Several negroes were helping him get it out when Dr. Haart and Wood Lake happened on the scene and took the boy and auto in charge. The boy, who gave his name as Nathan Denison, is evidently of unsound mind, as he was "just going to take a ride like other people" in the machine. He was taken to the county jail and locked up and will be given a hearing.

The machine was not injured and was brought back up town as good as ever.

HARRIS WILL VOTE

ON CHAMBERLAIN BONDS

Proposition to Issue \$1,250,000 to Be Put With Like Proposition by the Government.

Special to The Messenger. Houston, Nov. 30.—The county commissioners today fixed January 10 for an election to decide upon the ship canal bonds. The Houston navigation district has been created and Houston and the county propose to issue \$1,250,000 bonds which money will be added to a like amount appropriated by the government for the completion within two years of the channel to the minimum depth of twenty-five feet. The city at the same election decides a proposition to issue bonds of \$500,000 to build a viaduct across the channel.

DIFFICULTY IN GETTING JURY TO TRY FLEMING.

Dallas, Nov. 30.—Little progress was made this morning in the trial of Fred Fleming, charged with receiving deposits when he knew that the Western Bank and Trust company, of which he was president, was failing. Thirty-six men were examined in an effort to secure jurors, all except nine being challenged for cause. Judge R. B. Seay ordered one hundred talesmen for tomorrow and adjourned court.

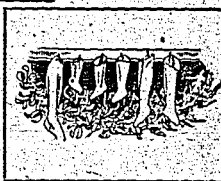
