Session 3 - The Light of Jesus (White)

Objective: By the end of this session, your child will understand that the colour white symbolises the purity and light of Jesus, who was born to bring light into a dark world. They will explore how Jesus' birth represents a new beginning, where He covers our sins and makes us as white as snow.

Main Scripture: John 1:1-9; Isaiah 1:18

Focus of the Christmas Story: The Birth of Jesus as the Light of the World.

Memory Verse: "'I am the light of the world. Whoever follows Me will never walk in the darkness, but will have the light of life.'" John 8:12

Main Points:

Introduction: Start with a quick recap of Mary and Joseph's journey to Bethlehem. Ask your child questions like, "What do you remember about their journey? How do you think they felt when they finally found the stable?" Encourage them to put themselves in the shoes of Mary and Joseph.

After this brief recap, introduce today's focus: "Today, we're going to learn about how Jesus' birth brought light into the world! When we think about light, what colour comes to mind?" Let them respond. Then explain that white is often seen as a colour of purity, light, and new beginnings.

Ask: "What are some white things we see around Christmas?" (Snow, angels, stars on the tree.) Use these answers to introduce today's lesson about Jesus, the Light of the World.

Bible reading: Read John 1:1-9 together. This passage explains that Jesus is the Word made flesh and the light that shines in the darkness. Discuss with your child how Jesus existed from the very beginning, just like we learned in the first session. When He was born, He brought light into a world that was full of darkness—where people didn't know God fully, and sin was everywhere.

Explain that Jesus' birth was like a bright light shining in a dark room. Just like how a light helps us see when it's dark, Jesus helps us see the truth about God and how much He loves us. He shows us the way to live a life that is pure and pleasing to God.

Jesus makes us clean: Gather the children and ask, "What are some things we do that are wrong, like lying or cheating?" As they call out sins, write them on the whiteboard with a dark marker. Explain, "These sins leave marks on our hearts, just like these marks on the board."

Hold up a clean white object and ask, "Which reminds you of Jesus' purity—this clean object or the messy board?"

Explain that Jesus is pure and without sin. Now, using a cloth or eraser, wipe away all the sins from the board. Say, "When we ask Jesus to forgive us, He wipes away all our sins, just like this." Read Isaiah 1:18: "Though your sins are like scarlet, they shall be as white as snow."

Light and Mirror Activity: Turn off the lights or dim the room. Turn on a flashlight and say, "Jesus' life and teachings are like this flashlight. He shows us how to live and what is true, just like this light helps us see in the dark." Move the flashlight around the room to demonstrate how light reveals things we might not see otherwise.

Next, hold up a mirror and shine the flashlight onto it. The light will reflect off the mirror and onto the walls. Say, "We are called to be like this mirror. Just as the mirror reflects the light, we should reflect Jesus' light and love into the world around us. When we follow Him, His light shines through us to help others see the way too."

Encourage the children to think about how they can reflect Jesus' light—by being kind, helping others, or sharing God's love.

Application: Help your child understand that whenever they see something white—like snow, stars, or even a white Christmas decoration—they can remember that Jesus is the light of the world. Encourage them to think about how they can let Jesus' light shine in their lives, and how they can live in a way that reflects His holiness.

GROUP GAMES

SHADOW CHARADES

Objective: To have fun with shadows while reinforcing the idea that Jesus is the light that reveals the truth.

Materials Needed:

A large white sheet or screen

A bright light source (flashlight or lamp)

Instructions:

1. Set up the white sheet or screen in a darkened room, with the light source placed behind it to cast shadows.
2. One child at a time stands behind the sheet and acts out an action or pretends to be an object from a list.
3. The other children sit on the opposite side of the sheet and try to guess what the child is acting out, based only on the shadow they see.

Reflect: After the game, talk about how the shadow only shows part of the picture, but light reveals the full truth. Discuss how Jesus is the light that helps us see the truth and understand God's love and plan for us.

GUESS THE CHRISTMAS OBJECT

Objective: To reinforce the idea that Jesus came to bring light and help us see clearly, just as we need light to identify objects.

Materials Needed:

A pillowcase or opaque bag.

Various Christmas-related objects (e.g., a small ornament, a pinecone, a candy cane, etc)

Instructions:

1. Place one Christmas object at a time inside the pillowcase or bag without letting the children see it.
2. Have the children take turns feeling the object through the pillowcase or bag and guessing what it is.
3. After everyone has guessed, reveal the object to the group.
4. Repeat with different objects until all have been guessed.

Reflect: After the game, talk about how it was hard to guess the objects without seeing them, but once they were revealed, it became clear. Relate this to how Jesus, as the Light of the World, helps us see and understand things more clearly in life, bringing light to the darkness.



BIBLE MEMORY VERSE

Key Bible Verse: John 8:12

Memory Verse: "I am the light of the world. Whoever follows Me will never walk in the darkness, but will have the light of life."

Activity: "Light the Words" Memory Verse Challenge

1. Split up John 8:12 on separate pieces of white paper.
2. Tape the papers in various locations around the room (walls, furniture, floor).
3. Dim the lights or turn them off completely to create a dark room.
4. Give a child or team a flashlight.
5. The children take turns using the flashlight to "find the word" by shining it on each word in the correct order of the verse.
6. As they find each word, they say it out loud, continuing until the full verse is spoken.
7. Repeat the activity until everyone has a turn or until the children can say the verse from memory.

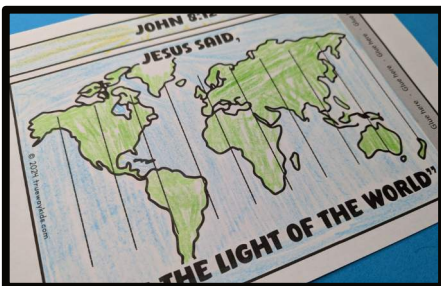
Light of the World Lantern



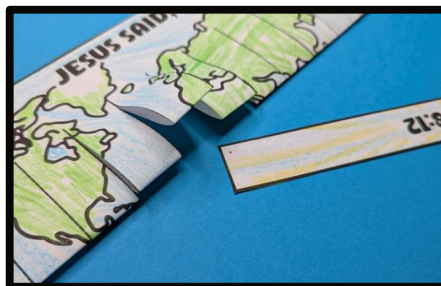
What you need:

Cut on the dash line only.



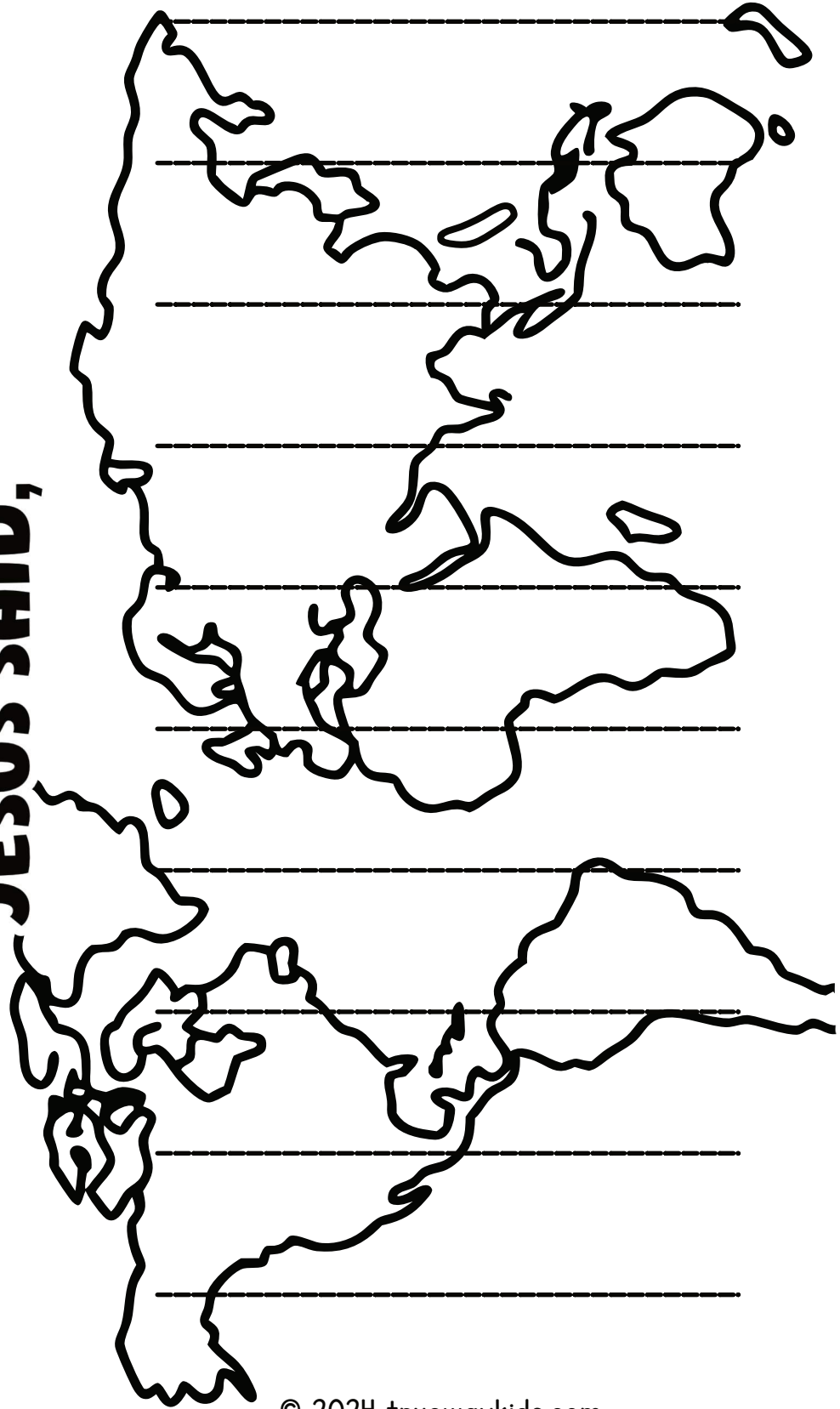
Glue large section where shown to make the lantern shape.

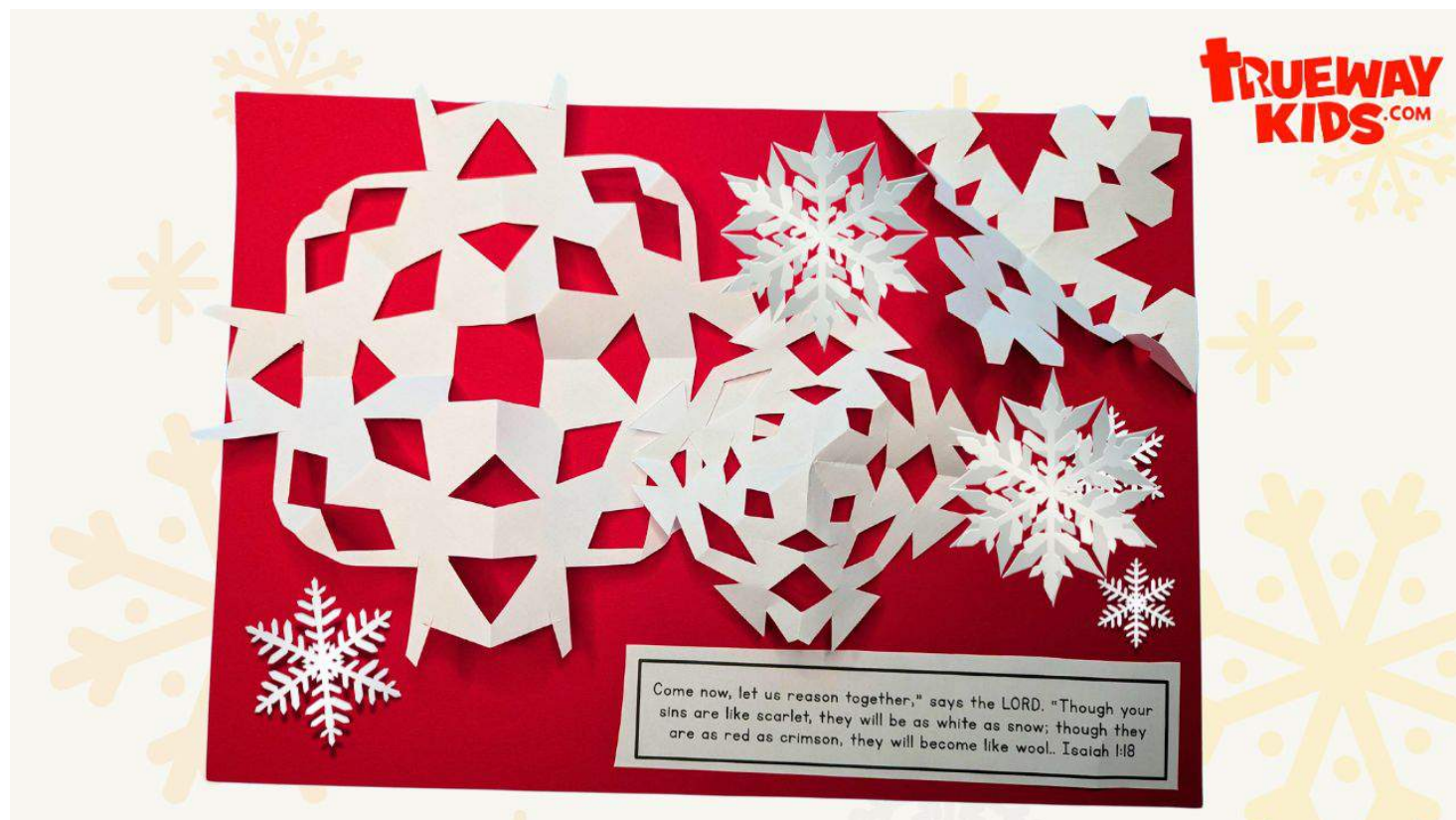

What you need:

- Scissors

- Printed or written verse: Isaiah 1:18

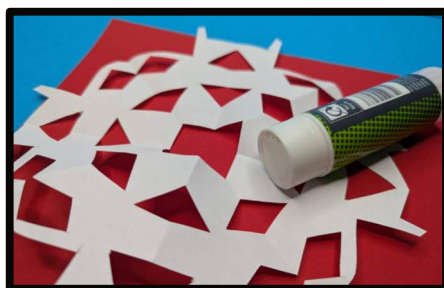
What to do:



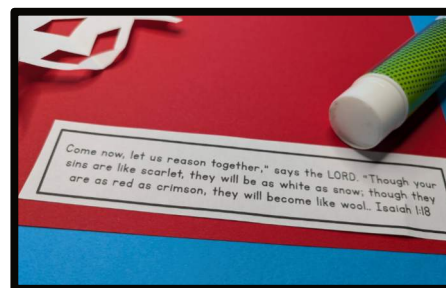
Start by folding the paper in half diagonally to form a triangle. Then fold the triangle in half again.

Children carefully cut small shapes from the folded edges of the paper.

Unfold for snowflake.



Repeat and glue snowflakes to red paper.

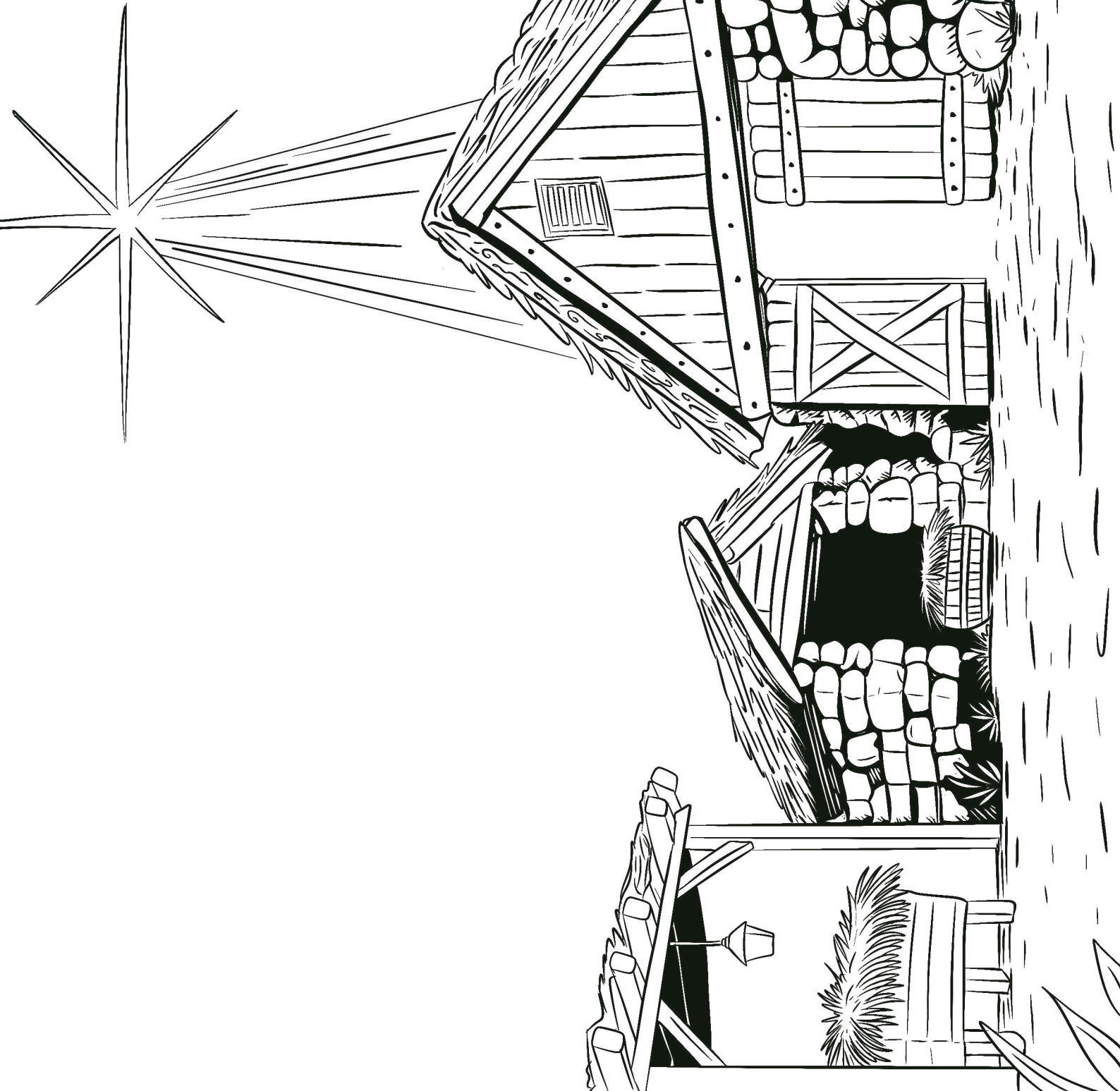

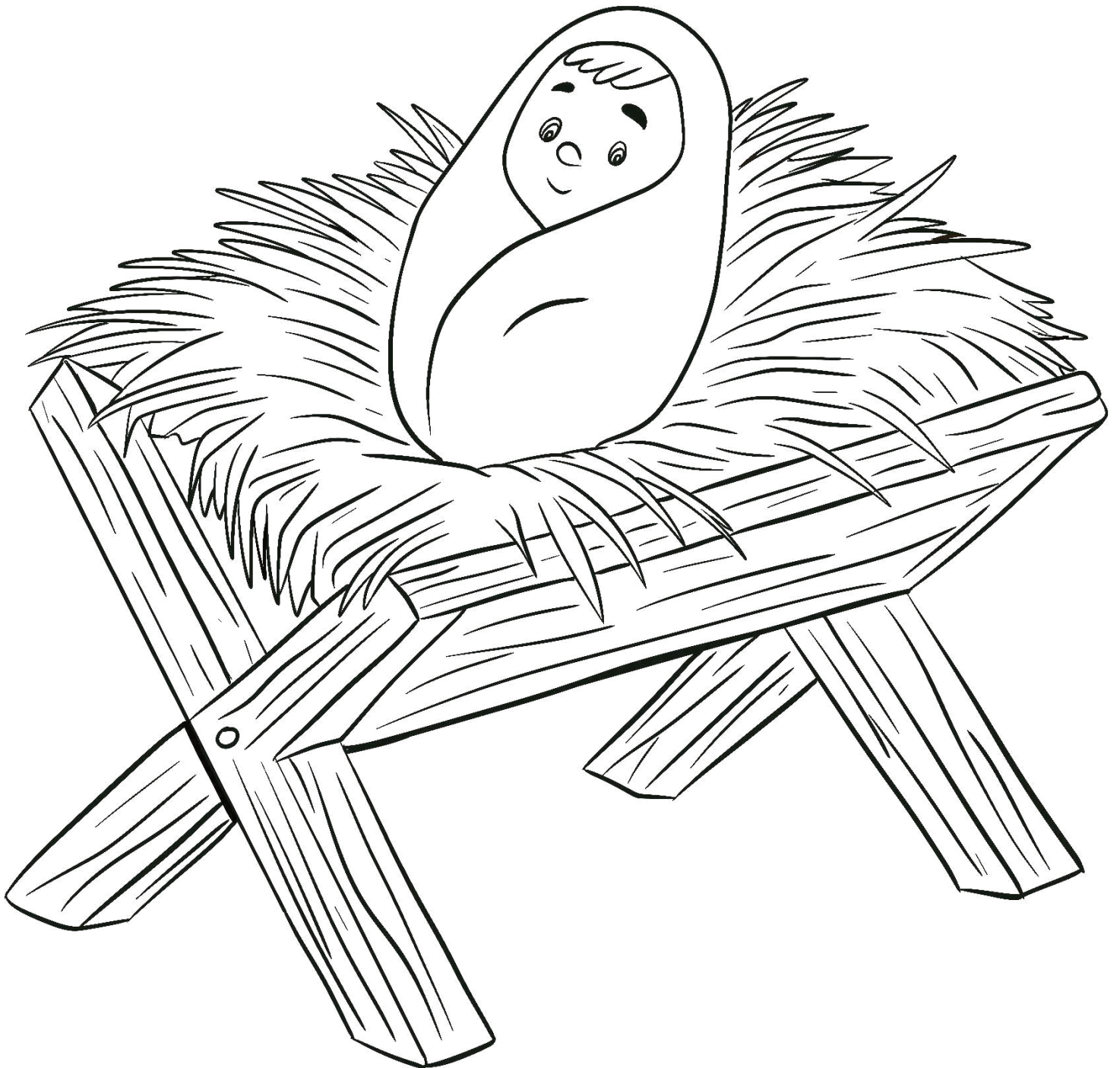
